

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## 1. Statement

This Green Infrastructure Statement supports an application for the erection of a covered slurry store on land at Lower Fawnog, Llanymynech.

The proposed building is to be located on agricultural greenfield land which is heavily farmed and grazed so therefore is of very low ecological value and offers little potential and will not result in the removal of any trees. There is an existing hedgerow to the south of the site which will be retained. The site has existing slurry stores to the east of similar size and design which further decreases the possibility of the site having functioning ecosystems.

The client has taken a step wise approach to GIS as they have ensured the proposed will have no detrimental effect on the existing green infrastructure on site. Connectivity between potential habitats on adjacent sites will not be negatively impacted by the proposed slurry store and there is no reason these will change.

The site is not within any statutory designed and should therefore be an acceptable location for the proposal. Off-site compensation is not required for the site as there will be no biodiversity affected. The client will ensure the management of the nearby hedgerow by ensuring it is cared for and maintained during the development and in the future.

The below satellite image shows the hedgerow to the south of the development site that will not be affected or removed.

It is clear the proposal does not have any adverse effect on biodiversity or ecosystem resilience and therefore should be considered acceptable.
